Holy Year pilgrimage to Rome - Monday 17th-Friday 21st February 2025. Cost will be £970 per person for a shared room or £1200 for a single room. Cost includes return flights from Stansted, four nights dinner, bed & breakfast in a 4* hotel, and full pilgrimage programme. Travel insurance is £65 for those who do not have other cover. Booking forms and details of the provisional pilgrimage programme are now available from Fr Eddy at St Hugh's. Please complete and return with £100 deposit per person and £65 insurance per

person or else indicate at the bottom of the form that you already have travel insurance. Payment either by cheque payable to Northern Star Travel or else give your card details on the form as requested. Fr Eddy will collate the forms over the next few weeks and then send them to Northern Star Travel.
