Bishop Patrick writes: 'We all greatly value the palliative end-of-life care provided by our 18 hospices but, while appealing for more government funded support, I believe we must play our part in supporting the work of the hospices within the diocese. So, I would like every parish to take up a mandatory second collection over the weekend of Saturday 16th and Sunday 17th November, which coincides with the Feast of our Patron, St Hugh of Lincoln.'
